With a focus on sustainable farming, they also offer a range of animal experiences for visitors to enjoy. Learn what it's like to be a shepherd with the Lake District Shepherd Experience. You can even enjoy a picnic in the company of the farm's rare breed Bagot goats!

Alpacaly Ever After offers the chance to meet alpacas and llamas near Keswick at the Lingholm Estate and the Lakes Distillery, with Meet & Greet, Alpaca Walking, and Llama Trekking experiences.

In the Wasdale Valley, enjoy a stroll through stunning landscapes with <u>Wastwater Alpaca Trekking</u>; while <u>King Garth Alpacas</u> offer experiences on the Solway coast near Carlisle.

Cumbria Heavy Horses Baystone Bank Farm, Whicham Valley, Millom LA18 5LY

A range of experiences are available at this family run Heavy Horse Riding Centre on the Cumbrian coast - the world's only BHS approved Heavy Horse Riding Centre

Whether you're an experienced equestrian or a novice rider, you can enjoy riding lessons and hands on experiences, or trot along golden sands of the Cumbrian coast with beach rides. Varying levels of experience are welcome (although be aware that restrictions apply to some activities).





Muncaster Hawk & Owl Centre Muncaster Castle, Ravenglass CA18 1RQ

At Muncaster Castle, alongside extensive gardens and a 'haunted' castle, you'll also find a hawk and owl centre. There's a strong focus on conservation and kids will love seeing the birds in the Centre and Owl Garden. Don't miss the impressive bird of prey flying displays, which take place against the backdrop of the castle and Lakeland fells.
