Silecroft and Muncaster

RECENTLY OPENED



Today, visit picturesque Silecroft: here, you'll find a modern beach cafe overlooking the Irish Sea. Opened in 2024, the building's bespoke shutters were designed by Scottish artist and Turner Prize winner Martin Boyce.

Also at Silecroft, new externally accessed toilets include a Changing Places facility for visitors with additional needs.

TOP TIP: Keep an eye out for pop-up artworks on display as part of an ongoing coastal arts programme.

RECENTLY OPENED

Weapons Hall at Muncaster Castle Ravenglass CA18 1RQ

The family owned and inhabited Muncaster Castle is said to be the most haunted castle in the country! Visitors are welcome to wander through the extensive gardens, explore the castle and catch a bird of prey show.

2024 saw the opening of the Medieval Weapons Hall, where you can try your hand at becoming a medieval knight with activities like axe throwing, archery and jousting!

2025 ANNIVERSARY

Ravenglass & Eskdale Railway celebrates its 150th birthday

Watch out for celebrations galore, as one of the oldest and longest narrow gauge railways in England turns 150. The railway also added a brand new Changing Places facility in 2024, as well as an Outdoor Mobility scooter for visitors to hire.

RECENTLY OPENED

The Yew Tree Pub

The historic Yew Tree Pub has been newly reopened after closing its doors 15 years ago. Located in Seatoller near Keswick, it boasts a riverside beer garden, and offers home cooked food with a modern twist.

TOP TIP: Keep an eye out for events throughout the year, from the 'Dragcaster' drag event to rock festivals and an annual sausage festival.



DAY 2

Coastal Discovery

NEW IN 2025

The Edge 8 West Strand, Whitehaven CA28 7LR

In the afternoon, head to Whitehaven - the 'Coastal Gateway to the Lakes' - to discover a new £4.5million harbourfront coastal activity centre. The only one of its kind in the north west, The Edge will support coastal recreational activities, as well as boasting changing facilities, an events gallery, cafe, and accommodation - all across three floors.

NEWLY ADDED -LIMITED TIME ONLY



Until the end of February 2025, Workington is host to the Workington Art Trail, featuring the work of three visual artists: Alison Critchlow, Melissa Davies and Rosie Galloway-Smith. Artworks will be installed in shop windows, with a digital map and information available to help visitors enjoy and learn about each piece.

NEW IN 2025



Spend the morning in the coastal town of Maryport, where a £12m regeneration project is taking place.

The town's harbourside play area is being completely redeveloped, with a new pirate-themed splash park and playground featuring slides, swings and a zipwire to replace the old site.

Further regeneration projects include a new cafe and beach shop on the town's promenade; a new bike and skate track; a harbourside events space; and the revamp of the newly-named Maryport Activity Centre (formerly the Wave centre). Recently completed work includes a reconfiguration of Senhouse Street, and the creation of an accessible beachfront boardwalk connecting the promenade and the harbour.

The town's Maritime Museum is also moving, into the newly restored Christ Church on the harbour.



DAY 3



RECENTLY EXPANDED

Tullie

Castle St, Carlisle, CA3 8TP

Standing in the heart of Carlisle, Tullie is a museum, art gallery and community hub showcasing fine and decorative art, human history and natural sciences. After extensive refurbishment, Tullie reopened in 2024 following the completion of Phase 2 of Project Tullie: a multi-year plan to transform the museum.

Visitors can now enjoy a revitalised entrance and atrium space, new retail offer, and brand-new ground floor gallery dedicated to the city of Carlisle. There's also a new food and drink offering at the on-site cafe.

2025 EXPANSION

Carlisle city centre regeneration

- Devonshire Street, in the heart of Carlisle city centre, is home to numerous shops and eateries. It's been newly transformed with wider pavements alongside new seating areas, cycle parking, trees and plants.
- Also in August 2024, work began on a Market Square and Greenmarket Regeneration Project, which will transform a 6,000 square-metre area in the city centre into a vibrant, multifunctional events space.
- A redevelopment of Carlisle Station is underway, with proposals to rejuvenate the high street in place.

For something a little bit different, why not try out one of these more quirky experiences?

Moorforge Viking Settlement

Experience life like a Viking at this heritage settlement. Look out for reenactments, workshops, festivals and events. The site can also be booked for group stays.

Soldiers in Silloth

A quirky, volunteer run museum thought to be the only one in Britain dedicated purely to toy soldiers. Created from a private collection of 10,000+ figures. Limited hours; forward bookings generally required.

Goat picnic at **Cragg House Farm**

Enjoy a picnic with a difference at a traditional hill farm in the stunning Buttermere valley. Their exclusive picnic area is available to book, complete with 6-seater picnic bench and a small herd of rare breed Bagot goats!
